



BTEC Level 1 Introductory Certificate in Digital Media - P113

This course provides learners with opportunities to develop the essential knowledge, skills and behaviours needed for progression within further education.

COURSE DETAILS

This course will introduce you to a range of fundamental techniques and skills needed for a career in the creative arts industry. While studying this course, you will have opportunities to develop your knowledge and skills in the areas of music performance and production. You will also have access to a range of subject specialist resources and facilities.

ENTRY GUIDELINES

This is a study programme for students aged 16-18 years.

Relevant Entry Level qualification or 3GCSEs at Grade 2/E or above.

Satisfactory interview and assessment.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

There are no vocational exams on this course. Students will complete five units that are internally assessed, and externally verified.

- Meaningful work experience or preparation for work
- English and maths, if you don't already have GCSE grade A*-C in English and maths (grade 4 and above)
- Non-study activities such as tutorials, voluntary work, fund-raising/charity work, sport or trips.
