Digital and Computing Technologies - Introduction - C054

This course offers an engaging programme for those with a clear interest in the vocational area of Information Communication Technology (ICT). It will develop knowledge, understanding and skills necessary, vocationally and personally, to prepare for employment or move onto a level 2 qualification, providing a high standard of work is achieved.

COURSE DETAILS

This programme will enable you to study a wide range of skills, all of which will help you progress on your chosen career pathway, moving into employment or further training. You will get the opportunity to gain a nationally recognised vocational qualification linked to your chosen career. This programme will help you to improve your maths, English and ICT skills, as well as develop the personal and social skills employers look for. You will be given support and guidance throughout your learning journey and your progress will be reviewed with you regularly.

The course covers areas such as:

- Computer components and how they work
- Computer programs and how to use them
- Skills necessary to gain employment
- Functional skills

ENTRY GUIDELINES

A relevant Entry Level qualification or 3 GCSEs grades 2/E or equivalent. This should include English and Maths.

Satisfactory interview, assessment (ICT), school report and/or satisfactory reference.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

Assessment will be carried out mainly through assignments. Where this is not appropriate observations and/or witness statements may be used.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Students will be required to read, respond to and produce written materials to meet assessment requirements.

Are you aged 16-18?

Study programmes are full-time courses for 16-18 year olds which include:

- A qualification such as a BTEC Extended Diploma
- Meaningful work experience or preparation for work
- English and maths, if you don't already have GCSE grade A* - C (grade 4 or above) in English and maths
