19+ Learner Support Fund / Advanced Learner Loan Bursary Application Form 2021/22

19+ Learner Support Fund and Advanced Learner Loan Bursary offers support to students who may encounter financial barriers to learning, giving financial help towards the cost of travel, meals, equipment, educational visits and other course related costs.

Students aged 19+ (on 31/08/21) studying on courses funded by the Liverpool City Region (LCR) Combined Authority's (CA) Adult Education Budget are eligible to apply for 19+ Learner Support Fund.

Students aged 19+ (on 31/08/21) studying level 3 to 6 who have an approved Advanced Learner Loan to pay for their course fees are eligible to apply for Advanced Learner Loan Bursary.

If you are aged 19-24 and have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) you need to apply for 16-19 Bursary Fund.

If you are aged 19 on 31/08/2021 and continuing a study programme you started aged 16-18 (19+ continuer) you need to apply for 16-19 Bursary Fund.

There is no automatic entitlement to funding, applications will be assessed and support will be awarded dependent on your needs and funds being available.

Before you complete this form please read the information carefully and complete all sections that apply to you. If you are having any difficulty completing the form we are here to help and have a team in place to help you understand what funding you may be entitled to and answer any questions you may have.

Bursary applications should be submitted along with supporting evidence no later than 4 weeks after the start date of your course. Bursary support will start from the date you have provided all the information needed to assess your application. Back payments are not guaranteed and if you don't provide us with evidence of your household income we are unable to assess your eligibility for bursary support.

Priority support will be given to students with supporting evidence showing a household income below £30,000. If your household income is above this, please still complete a form as we may be able to take into account your individual circumstances and the cost of participating on your chosen course.

Data Protection & Privacy

The College Privacy Statement will be sent to you via your college email account.

Further Information

19+ Learner Support Fund & Advanced Learner Loan Bursary are cash limited government funds administered by the college. The purpose of the fund is to provide partial financial aid to students who may have difficulty completing their course due to financial hardship.

Students are not eligible to apply if they are:-

- enrolled on a community learning or higher education course
- released on temporary license (RoTL)
- aged 19-24 and have an Education, Health & Care plan (EHCP)
- waged apprentices

Appeals

Applicants have the right to appeal if they are not satisfied with any decision regarding bursary support or payments. Appeals must be made in writing and sent to:

If you have any mitigating circumstances please provide supporting evidence, for example doctor's note, hospital appointment etc. Appeals must be received within four weeks of the date you are appealing. The appeals panel will meet on a termly basis. We will inform you in writing with the outcome of your appeal. Please be aware the decision of the appeals panel is final.

Declaration:

- I confirm that the information I have given is true and correct.
- I agree to notify the college in writing of any change in my circumstances which may affect my eligibility for funding.
- I understand that I will have to repay any funds if the information I have provided is not correct.
- I have read and understood the further information section and confirm that none of those exceptions apply to me.
- I understand that funding is limited and not guaranteed and eligibility does not automatically mean entitlement.
- I understand that bursary support will start from the date I have provided all the information needed to assess and approve my application and back payments are not guaranteed.
- I understand that the college expects 100% attendance and bursary support is dependent upon a minimum attendance of 90%, behaviour, punctuality and achievement while at college.
- I understand it is my responsibility to inform the Department for Work and Pensions about any learner support I receive as a leader support / bursary payments may affect my eligibility to some benefits.
